Program Overview

Leadership Beaverton is a 9-month program consisting of one mandatory opening reception and retreat. During the opening session, each participant's leadership style is brought forth through an exercise called SIMSOC. Regular mandatory class sessions are held each subsequent month, usually the second Thursday. A graduation luncheon follows the final session. The agendas for each session are developed by the most recent class graduates, known as Co-chairs. Additional required and/or optional outside reading material are sometimes given to develop a better understanding of the month's topic.

Goals of the Program

Develop awareness of the community by examining the major system that contributes to patterns of life in the city.

Enhance leadership skills and qualities in participants that lead to creative and insightful community solutions.

Ensure broad community future leadership by recruiting emerging leaders with diverse social, economic and professional backgrounds.

Motivate and encourage participants to assume leadership roles in community affairs.

Participant Commitment to attending the opening retreat sessions, eight program days, graduation ceremony day, plus development and orchestration of a class project (some work outside of program days will most likely be required), and as a Co-chair in the program year following graduation.

Application Process

Applications are being accepted now for the 2012-2013 program year. Space is limited. The Board of Directors reviews approximately 30 applications yearly and **accepts no more than 25 participants**. The Board works to ensure that the participants reflect diverse employment and interaction within our community. This review is confidential.
